This issue of I Connect features an unusual human interest story of Jyothika- We always thought that providing Security is a male domain. Jyothika proves otherwise!

When Jyotika attended the I Create AEW workshop in 2003, she was newly married. Jyotika always wanted to make something of her life and the AEW gave her that opportunity and the tools to do it. After the AEW, she decided to start her own business. She started a beauty parlour business with mentoring by Joseph Pius. Even though Jyotika had not finished High School and was only 7th class pass, her husband was a college graduate. Jyotika had big dreams for herself and her husband but her husband was not as motivated as she was. He merely wanted to stay in the village and become a farm laborer.

Jyotika knew that she and her husband had no future in the village. So she went to Baroda much against the wishes of her in-laws and lived there by herself. She repeatedly asked her husband to come and join her there. He finally agreed and moved to Baroda. Once in Baroda, she found him a job in a security firm while she herself continued with her beauty parlour business. But Jyotika's interest in the security business started growing as she saw great opportunity there. She learned as much as she could about the security business and motivated her husband to start a security business of their own which she helped to run. The security business is doing so well that they now have 60 employees. Jyotika and Vijay have even bought a bomb sniffing dog for Rs. 20,000 which they rent out to different organizations. They have now bought a house of their own.

Having tasted the excitement of doing business and making good money, Jyotika started many side businesses such as selling saris and artificial jewelry from her house. She also has a team of women whom she has trained to serve food and drinks at parties. She makes good money from this business as well.

Jyotika decided that if she had to spend time taking care of her three daughters at home, she would not be able to run her business and provide for them well. So she sent them to a boarding school nearby so she could keep an eye on them and at the same time run her various businesses and travel freely. She has travelled all over India to attend various conferences, seminars and meetings. Sometimes, she is invited as a speaker.

Now Jyotika's dream is to serve the community by motivating 30 women in her community to become entrepreneurs like her. She believes that it is only by becoming economically independent that a woman can earn the respect of her family and community. Once she starts bringing in money her position in the family changes. She is then able to make independent decisions for herself and her children. Jyotika is a role model for her community.

When we visited the Regional Vocational Training Center in a low income community of Mumbai,

I Create Safar Master Trainers were evaluating the Business Plan presentations by the girls who had just finished their five day intensive entrepreneurship program conducted by I Create Safar. Also visiting with us were members of board of our affiliate,

I Create (Gujarat Govt and Private Enterprise Joint undertaking). The members were:

Also present was Dr. Arvind Agrawal, President – Corporate Development & Human Resources.RPG Enterprises, as an observer.

The room was full. There were about 30 girls who came from low income families. They were thin and small which made us think perhaps they were undernourished. They gave the impression of being shy and timid. However, when they came up in front of the class and several strangers (including all of us visitors), they very confidently presented their Business Plans using PowerPoint. They had been divided into groups of six. Each group member covered one aspect of their business plan so that everyone had a chance to speak. They covered among other subjects:

- Identification of business opportunity and market research
- Marketing, pricing and distribution plan
- Competitive factors and risks mitigation
- Costing of unit of sales of their product or service
- Break even, Cash flow and income statement
- How to raise startup capital and keep it a low cost operation in the initial stages

All of us were impressed by each of the presentation including the props they had created, as also the samples of their products, brochures and business cards, all with their company name, logo and tagline!.
