Meeting the Karmayogi

He was a keen listener and was very much impressed by our motto of "Creating Job Creators" which was attuned to his own thinking. He made useful suggestions about creating business incubation centers all across the country – in rural and urban areas.

His message was included in the "101 Representative Success Stories of I Create Entrepreneurs". He autographed a copy of the book and one copy was given to him.
